Work is nearing completion on the Edgewater Beach House. Guests will enjoy enhancements to the beach parking lot, improvements to the trail system along the beach and the construction of a new plaza and aerial community connector.

The new community connector will connect the W. 76th Street pedestrian tunnel to the second floor of the Beach House, allowing great views of sunsets, Lake Erie and downtown Cleveland.

The replacement Beach House will feature an expanded concession operation with made to order items from a locally based menu along

with the expected beach fare. New restrooms and changing areas will be constructed along with new foot wash stations for beachgoers. The second floor of the Beach House features an expansive covered open-air pavilion with a seasonal outdoor bar and fireplace.

The Beach House is expected to open in early June. The Edgewater LIVE season kicks off June 8 and this year, we've doubled the entertainment by adding an opening act. Detailed info on the lineup can be found here: clevelandmetroparks.com/edgewater.
