MYCOM: "YOUTH DEVELOPMENT IS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT"

MyCom is a network connecting Greater Cleveland youth to programming in their neighborhoods, preparing them for their futures while giving back to their communities. The 10-year-old network includes 21 communities. Detroit Shoreway Community Development Organization (DSCDO) and Cudell Improvement Inc. (Cudell) are excited to partner with MyCom in 2019 to ensure the network will cover the Detroit Shoreway, Cudell, and Edgewater neighborhoods.

The Near West Side is already home to outstanding youth programming at neighborhood theaters, parks, recreation centers, and libraries. Partnering with MyCom will help connect youth to these programs, and identify gaps were future programming could be beneficial. Stay tuned for a guide coming this summer compiling all Detroit Shoreway, Cudell, and Edgewater neighborhood youth programming opportunities. A steering committee of youth-serving organizations, schools, and residents will assist with the information gathering process.

MYCOM YOUTH EMPLOYMENT

Two youth employment programs are available in partnership with Youth Opportunities Unlimited: a year round program for 18-24 year olds, and a summer employment program for 14-24 year olds. Summer employment starts in early June and ends in August. Registration begins in late winter/ early spring.

CIFF TO EXPAND PRESENCE IN GORDON SQUARE

The Cleveland International Film Festival (CIFF) is thrilled to bring more to the Festival than ever before! In addition to the screenings at Tower City Cinemas, CIFF is expanding the scope of its footprint with the addition of two Festival hubs – CIFF East (University Circle) and CIFF West (Gordon Square Arts District).

CIFF West will debut in Gordon Square the first weekend of CIFF43 on the evening of Thursday, March 28th, followed by two full days of programming on Friday, March 29th and Saturday, March 30th. Screenings will take place at Capitol Theatre and Near West Theatre.

More than 500 screenings will take place during the 12 days of the Festival, with more than 300 guest filmmakers from around the world on-hand for Q&As. FREE TAX PREP, RIGHT IN YOUR OWN NEIGHBORHOOD

The Detroit Shoreway neighborhood will benefit from free tax preparation thanks to the Enterprise-Led Cuyahoga Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) Coalition. The Gordon Square Arcade tax site (6516 Detroit Avenue, computer lab) is open Monday and Tuesday from 5pm-8pm, and Saturdays from 9am-1pm. If you make less than \$54,000 a year, let Cuyahoga EITC do your taxes for free. Call Cuyahoga EITC at 2-1-1 or visit refundohio.org/tax-help to schedule an appointment.

With the help of 300 IRS-certified volunteers, 25 Site Coordinators, and 40 partner organizations, Cuyahoga EITC is able to provide free tax preparation to over 10,000 residents each year. PROJECT RED CORD

"Project Red Cord" is a community street outreach initiative headed by the Renee Jones Empowerment Center and supported by DSCDO and other partners. Project Red Cord was created in response to concerns from neighborhood residents after the "kNOw Human Trafficking" community gathering in Spring 2018. Since the first Project Red Cord on June 7th 2018, the following services have been provided to community members on 7 different evenings:

- Free food
- Free personal hygiene products for women
- SNAP benefits (food stamps through the Greater
- Cleveland Food Bank)
- Counselors provided on site from the Cleveland Rape Crisis Center
- Free Narcan and Naloxone kits and training provided by The MetroHealth System Project DAWN Cuyahoga County
- "Street Cards" with important numbers
- Free clothing, toys, and bicycles for kids

The initiative has been an opportunity to engage with residents living in a section of Detroit Shoreway suffering from poverty, drug overdose/addiction, and the highest level of prostitution in the city of Cleveland. Stay tuned for similar street outreach initiatives in 2019.
