HEBREW FREE LOAN ASSOCIATION OF NORTHEAST OHIO (HFLA)

HFLA lends money interest-free to responsible individuals in need. Maximum loan amount is \$10,000. Applicants must have verifiable income that will allow them to repay the loan and have one or more suitable guarantors for the loan. If the loan is for home repairs, work must be done by an insured and bonded contractor, and estimates must be turned in with application.

HERITAGE HOME PROGRAM

The Heritage Home Program offers a low-interest, fixed-rate, equity-based loan for maintaining and improving older homes. Interest rates can go up to 2% in Cleveland. Homes must be 50 years old or older and located in a participating community. Interior and exterior projects qualify. No income limits apply.

Also provides free technical assistance for home repair, maintenance and rehab needs.

COMMUNITY HOUSING SOLUTIONS

Assists low and moderate income seniors with critical home repairs, including: heating, plumbing, carpentry, security, roofing, and accessibility. Applicant must be homeowner and own their home for at least one year, meet income guidelines, and be current on property taxes or on a payment plan.

GUTTER AND DOWNSPOUT PROGRAM

Provides gutter cleaning. Provides repairs or replacement of gutters. Provides repairs or replacement of downspouts. Applicant must be the homeowner, own their home for at least one year, meet income guidelines, and be current on property taxes or on a payment plan. For gutter cleaning must also be at least age 60 or an adult 18-59 with a disability.

HOME WEATHERIZATION AND HOUSEWARMING ASSISTANCE

No cost weatherization programs designed to assist with the energy efficiency of rental or owner occupied income eligible dwellings. Services may include furnace repair/replacement, hot water tank repair/replacement, insulation, refrigerator and/or freezer replacement, light bulbs and electrical repairs/updates.

PLUMBING/SEWER REPAIR

Minor plumbing repairs, water leaks, hot water tank replacement, main water line repair, and clearing of blockage or replacement of main sewer line. Programming is available to homeowners and renters. Applicants must meet income guidelines.

REBUILDING TOGETHER NEO SAFE AT HOME/HANDYMAN PROGRAM

Program provides minor home repairs to address safety and accessibility issues, such as: storm doors, door knobs and deadbolts, grab bars, handrails, smoke and CO detectors, minor bathroom modifications, etc. Applicants must own their home, be current on property taxes or be on a payment plan, have homeowner's insurance, and meet income requirements.

CUYAHOGA COUNTY HOUSING ENHANCEMENT LOAN PROGRAM

Applicants must be current on property taxes or on a payment plan. The property value must be \$250,000 or below. Participating banks are Key Bank and Huntington. Applications for the program can be obtained at any branch.

Provides temporary and emergency financial assistance to eligible veterans, their dependents, and surviving spouses. Applicants must demonstrate financial need. Financial assistance is provided for mortgage, rent, security deposit, and other needs on a case by case basis.

CITY OF CLEVELAND

SENIOR HOMEOWNER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SHAP) AND AGE-FRIENDLY HOME INVESTMENT PROGRAM (AFHIP)

SHAP and AFHIP provide grants to income qualified Cleveland residents 60 years old or older and disabled adults (18-59 years) who reside in and own single or two family homes in need of critical health, safety, and maintenance repairs. Typical repairs include roof, porch, ramp installation, major plumbing and electrical repairs. Only one repair can be addressed.

This program helps homeowners repair Cleveland homes by offering low-interest loans ranging from 0%-3%, determined by total household income. These loans are only for code related repairs, mechanical repairs, or health and safety repairs. A photo ID, proof of address (copy of mortgage, insurance, utility bill, etc.) and proof of income are required.

CLEVELAND TREE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR SENIORS

Trims or removes hazardous trees and branches. Applicants must be a low-income senior homeowner or an adult 18-59 receiving a disability payment. Must reside in and own a single or two family home. The tree of concern must be on personal property or touching personal property from a neighboring property. Applicant must be current on property taxes or in a payment plan.

BED BUG ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

This program to helps seniors and adults with disabilities, on a limited income, with the extermination of bed bugs in their home. Applicants must meet income guidelines, be 60 years of age or older or an adult, 18-59 years old, receiving a disability payment, and own and live in the unit to be treated.

CLEVELAND 50/50 SIDEWALK RESIDENTIAL REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

Repair/replacement of unsafe sidewalks through a partnership between the City of Cleveland and its residents where each party pays 50% of the cost. Eligible repairs include sidewalks, driveway aprons and curbs at the end of driveways.

LEAD HAZARD CONTROL PROGRAM

This program provides assistance to control lead-based paint hazards. Residents living in older homes with children under the age of six years of age or younger and whose incomes are within program guidelines may participate.

PAINT PROGRAM

The Exterior Paint Program provides paint and materials for exterior home painting. Labor is not included. Homeowners and tenants who meet income guidelines can apply for the program. Program is administered on a first-come, first-serve basis.

LEAD SAFE RESOURCE CENTER

The Lead Safe Cleveland Coalition hosts a resource center connecting our community's lead poisoning prevention efforts. Any home built before 1978 is presumed to contain leadbased paint. Beginning March 31, 2021, all rental units built before 1978 must have a Lead Safe Certification from the City of Cleveland's Department of Building and Housing. The Lead Safe Certification is valid for two years. The Lead Safe Cleveland Coalition offers guidance about the Lead Safe Certification to property owners. It also works on education and community engagement, increased screening and testing for lead poisoning, and early intervention for children and families impacted by lead. Information about loans and grants may also be available.

TOOL LOAN PROGRAM

Allows City of Cleveland residents to borrow tools to assist in the completion of home maintenance and repair projects. Includes the following type of tools: Lawn and garden, household, ladders, miscellaneous hand tools, plumbing tools, and power hand tools. Photo ID and proof of residency required.

TIPS FOR HIRING A CONTRACTOR

When hiring a contractor for home improvement or repair, see some best practices below:

- Interview each contractor you are considering.
- Get estimates from various contractors for comparison.
- Verify if the contractor is licensed, bonded and insured to do work in the City of Cleveland by calling the City of Cleveland Department of Building and Housing (216-664-2910).
- Check your contractor with the local Better Business Bureau (BBB) 216-241-7678.
- Always request written contracts.

Understanding your payment options

- Do not let the contractor arrange a loan for you.
- Make sure your payment schedule is affordable.
- Do not pay the full amount up front.
- Avoid paying cash.
- Keep all copies of your paperwork and receipts.

WHEN DO I NEED A PERMIT?

The City of Cleveland requires permits for garages, sheds, decks, swimming pools, fences, roofs, windows, doors, and step/porch replacement. Permits are also required for all new construction, additions, and alterations. Alterations include replacing windows, doors, steps, porches and roofs. Always confirm your contractor is registered with the City of Cleveland.

HEALTHY HOMES INITIATIVE

The Healthy Homes Initiative is a partnership between the City of Cleveland and Community Development Corporations (CDCs) that seeks to improve the quality of life of residents through enhancements to the city's housing stock. Community engagement specialists have been hired at CDCs across the City and their work involves assessing neighborhood housing issues and working with residents and landlords to resolve concerns and challenges. Specialists build relationships with residents and landlords and connect them to programs and services they are eligible for. Additionally, they host trainings and workshops on a variety of housing and neighborhood topics.
